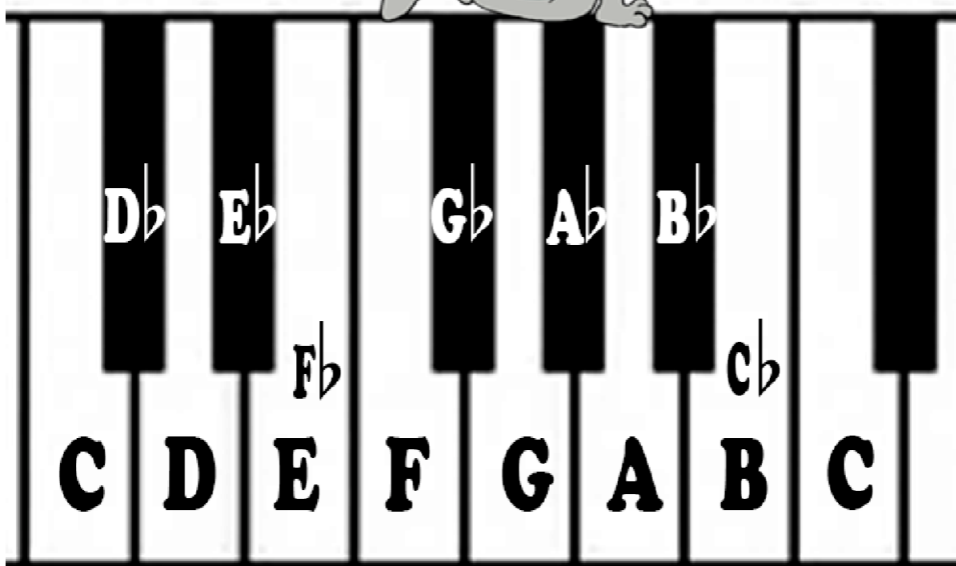
Enharmonic Notes

*Hi, Welcome to Book 6.
In the previous book, you learned
about Sharp and Flat Signs. Let's
review them:*





As you've learned, the **SHARP** Sign, before a Note, means play the next key to the right, whether black or white as shown in this picture.



The **FLAT** Sign, before a Note, means play the next key to the left, whether black or white as shown in this picture.

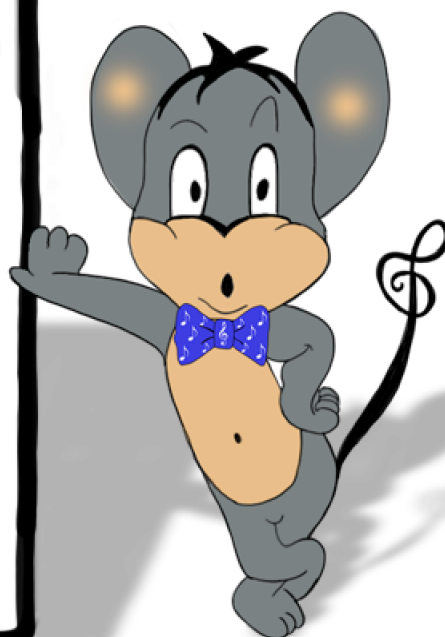
Wait a minute!
Something is wrong here!
Can Notes have more than one
name?



Of course!!!
And those Notes are called
Enharmonic.
They have the same sound but a
different name.



*En...har.....mic....
What???*



ENHARMONIC



*Don't be such a lazy mouse!
With some practice you can memorize all of
them!! I am going to introduce them to you
one by one!!*

*As you know, a
Sharp Sign raises
the Note a
Half Step.*



*This means play
the next Note to the
right.*

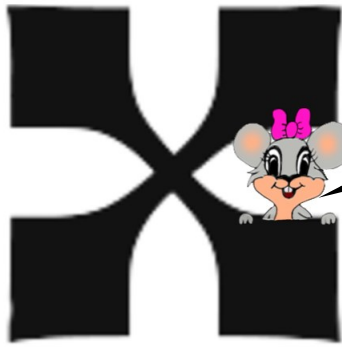


*A **Flat Sign** lowers
the Note a
Half Step.*



*This means play
the next Note to
the left.*





*This is a
Double Sharp
Sign!*

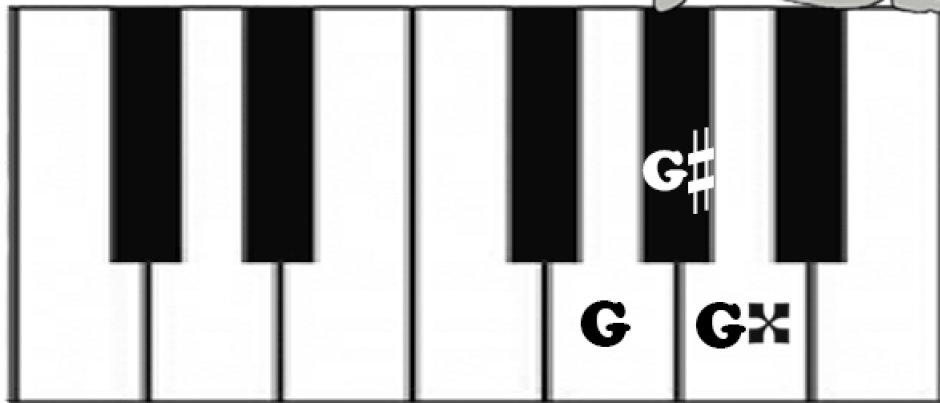


*It equals 2
Sharp Signs?*

*Exactly!
It raises the Note by 2
Half Steps.*

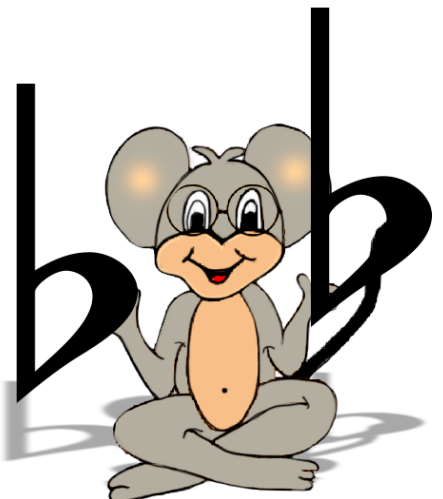


I got it!



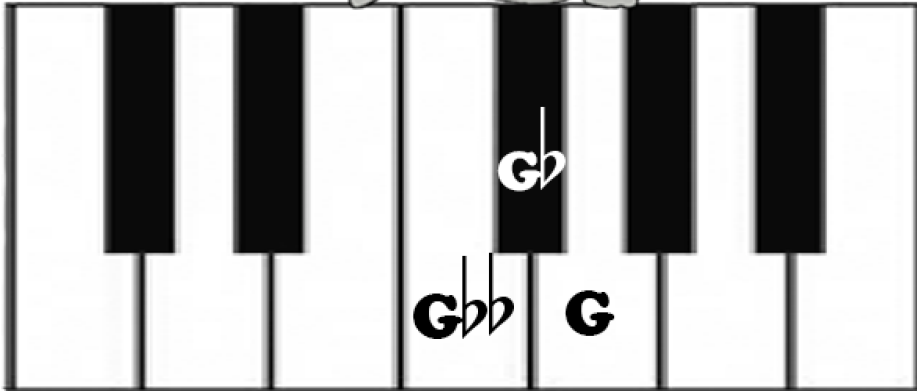
*This is a Double Flat
Sign!*

*It lowers the
Note 2
Half Steps.*





*Exactly! It lowers the Note
2 Half Steps!*



*I knew
it!*



*This is a
Natural Sign!*

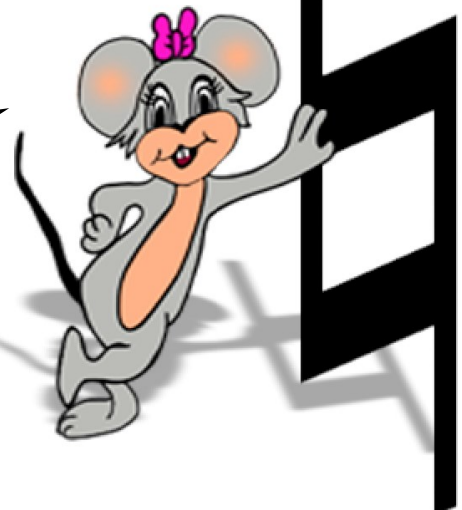
*What does it means
“Natural”?*

Natural?

?



*It means that the
Note returns
Natural!*



???



Right!! But, what does that exactly mean? It means that the Note is Normal?

*Precisely, it means **Back-to-Normal!***



*It cancels the effect of a previous **Flat** or **Sharp**. The Note returns as **Natural**, so you need to play the Note in the white Key, always, when you see a Natural Sign.*
